## RESOLUTION NO. R. 06-2005

## RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE BIG BEAR AREA REGIONAL WASTEWATER AGENCY ADOPTING AND AUTHORIZING REVISIONS TO THE LOCAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN WHICH IS PART OF THE SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY OPERATIONAL AREA'S MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

**WHEREAS**, the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA 2000) (Public Law 106-390) amended the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (the Act) by repealing the previous mitigation planning section (Section 409) and replacing it with Section 322; and

**WHEREAS,** to implement the DMA 2000 planning requirements, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) published Interim Final Rules (IFRs) in the Federal Register on February 26, 2002 and October 1, 2002; and

**WHEREAS,** these Interim Final Rules established the mitigation planning requirements for local governments and required that in order to remain eligible to receive federal funding for both pre-disaster and post-disaster mitigation project funding, a local government must have a FEMA approved and locally adopted Local Hazard Mitigation Plan written in accordance with Section 322 of the Act; and

**WHEREAS**, the Federal Emergency Management Agency has endorsed both Local and Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plans as a partnership encouraging multi hazard approaches to disaster resistant communities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Big Bear Area Regional Wastewater Agency have established both a local and multi-jurisdictional partnership with the County of San Bernardino to include their specific risks, hazards, current and future mitigation measures and goals and objectives;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Big Bear Area Regional Wastewater Agency adopt Resolution No. R. 06-2005, adopting the Local Hazard Mitigation Plan and its inclusion in the County of San Bernardino Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan.
